



Fire Response Plan

Objective

- Ensure the safety of all participants, staff and bystanders
- Implement rapid and effective responses to a fire emergency

Potential Fire Risks

- Petrol Generator: hot surfaces, fuel handling, electrical overloads
- Fuel Storage: Improper containers, proximity to heat sources
- Inflatables: Made from flammable PVC or nylon materials
- Smoking/BBQ's: Too close to equipment

Prevention Measures

- Place generators at least 3 meters from any inflatable structure
- Store petrol in approved fuel containers, away from public access.
- Keep fire extinguishers on-site and within 5 metres of generator.
- Prohibit smoking or open flames near equipment and inflatables.
- Perform pre-event safety checks on all electrical and fuel systems.

Emergency Procedures

- Shout **"FIRE"** to alert everyone nearby
- Stop all inflatable operations and turn off blower if safe to do so
- Evacuate participants away from danger
- If safe, attempt to extinguish fire using Dry Chemical extinguisher
- Do not attempt to fight large fires, evacuate immediately
- Call emergency services and report the nature of the fire, exact location, access point and any injuries

Always use clear verbal commands and point people towards the exits. Block any unsafe areas and do not allow re-entry until cleared by emergency services.

Site supervisor responsibilities

- Coordinate evacuation to designated Assembly Point
- Account for all staff and participants.
- Meet emergency responders at entry point

Post Fire Actions

- Do not use inflatables or generators again until inspected and approved.
- Complete formal Incident Report and notify insurance provider.
- Conduct internal debrief and safety review

Staff training

- All supervising staff are trained to comply with the safety procedures set out in the Mr Bouncy Castle Fire Response Plan
- Staff are trained to use the fire extinguisher

Additional training is provided to our event managers, responsible for monitoring events equipment and responsible for other staff members.

- Event Managers are trained to comply with procedures set out in the Medical Emergency Response Plan and Fire Response & Safety Plan
- Emergency plans and risk assessments are revised after every incident and reviewed annually
